

Diatonic Sevenths Chords of the Major & Minor Keys

In Eight Keys (Eight Is Enough)

A 7th chord is made of 4 notes: [1] the root, [2] major or minor 3rd, [3] perfect 5th or flat 5th, and [4] major 7, or flat 7 (minor 7), or flat-flat-7 (diminished 7).

Diatonic simply means the notes of the scale of that key. For example, in the key of C major, the diatonic 7th chords are 7th chords made from the C major scale. In the key of C minor, the diatonic 7th chords are all 3-note chords made from the C minor scale.
